Art Allen Randy Cross Jack Meader

- Graduated from Mont Pleasant HS in 1980
- Won letters in outdoor track (4), indoor track (2) & cross-country (1)
- Section 2 track champion in several events from 1978-80 (indoor & outdoor)
- ♦ 1979 NYS Indoor 330-yard champion
- 1980 NYS Indoor 300-meter champion; set NYS & National 300m record (35.1)
- ♦ 1980 NYS Indoor Track Athlete of the Year
- 1980 Eastern States 300-meter Indoor champion
- ♦ Indoor Track All-American
- ♦ 1980 NYS 200m Outdoor champion
- Held Sectional 200m record for 32 years (21.3)
- Ran in the 200m race at the 1980 USA Junior Nationals in Knoxville, TN
- Ran track at the U. of Houston for one year (with Carl Lewis)
- Transferred to Northeastern U.
- Won the 55m (6.32) at the Greater Boston Indoor Championships (still a record at NU); won the 100m & 200m at the 1983 New England Outdoor Championships (200m time of 21.27 set a meet & NU record at the time)
- Won gold medals in the 100m (10.54 -setting a Northeastern record) & 200m (20.94 - NU record that still stands) at the 1984 New England Outdoor Championships
- Anchored NU's gold medal winning 4x100m relay team at the 1985 New England Outdoor Championships (40.56 - NU record at the time)
- Anchored NU's 1985 IC4A 4x100m championship relay team (40.46 sec.—NU record for nearly 30 years)
- Nicknamed "Northeastern's Fastest Human"
- Inducted into the Northeastern U. Varsity Club Hall of Fame in 2012

- Graduated from Mont Pleasant HS in 1961
- Key member of the 1960-61 MP Basketball Team that finished 15-3 & ended Linton's 46-game winning streak
- Coached by Athletic Hall of Famers Dick & Walt Suprunowicz
- Also was a high jumper on the MP track meet; won the Rye High Invitational Track Meet
- Led his Boston U. Basketball Team in scoring all three years that he was on the varsity (NCAA rules at the time did not permit freshmen to play on the varsity)
- Averaged 18.2 ppg as a soph. & was named to the All-New England Second team
- ♦ Scored 44 points vs. Holy Cross (1/29/64)
- Shot 56% from the floor & averaged 19 ppg as a junior;
 named first team All-New England & ECAC All-East
- Averaged 18.9 ppg & 13 rpg as a 6'3" 170 lb senior; team captain
- B.U. career scoring leader when he graduated (1,159 points); averaged a double-double during his B.U. career (18.7 ppg & 11.1 rpg)
- Won "Athlete of the Year" & "Scholar Athlete of the Year" awards at B.U. in 1965; one of just two athletes in B.U. history to win both awards in the same year
- Currently has the 5th highest career scoring average & 4th highest career rebounding average in B.U. history
- Member of the B.U. Athletic Hall of Fame & the Upstate New York Basketball Hall of Fame

- ♦ Graduated from Nott Terrace HS in 1949
- Ran cross-country & track for Athletic Hall of Fame members Bill Eddy, Ray Vacca & Pete Shulha
- ♦ 1948 Sectional Outdoor 880-yard champion
- 1948: Utica-Proctor High School Cross-Country champion; NYU High School Cross-Country champion; Grout Run winner; Eastern United States Cross-Country champion
- 1948 Bill Stern Sch'dy Athlete of the Year (along with Tony Parisi)
- 1949: National AAU High School Indoor 1000 yd. champion; Eastern U.S. High School Outdoor 880 yd. champion (new record); Sectional Outdoor 440 yd. champion (new record); Adirondack AAU 880 yd. winner
- 1949 Nott Terrace HS track captain
- 1950 National AAU Prep School Indoor 440 & 880 yard champion, while attending The Hill School (PA)
- Millrose Games Association Outstanding Performance Award (1950)
- Along with his brother Jerry, he was a candidate for the 1952 Olympic team (unable to participate due to an injury)
- Ran at Yale University
- Heptagonal Outdoor 880 yd. champion (1:52.9) in 1954
- Finished 4th in the IC4A Indoor 1000 yd. Run at Madison Square Garden (1954)
- Connecticut AAU Outdoor 440 & 880 yd. champion (1953 & 1954)
- Won the Gardner Millet Award at Yale for Sportsmanship, Courage & Inspiration
- Announcer at the William F. Eddy, Jr. Memorial Track Meet for nearly 60 years.
