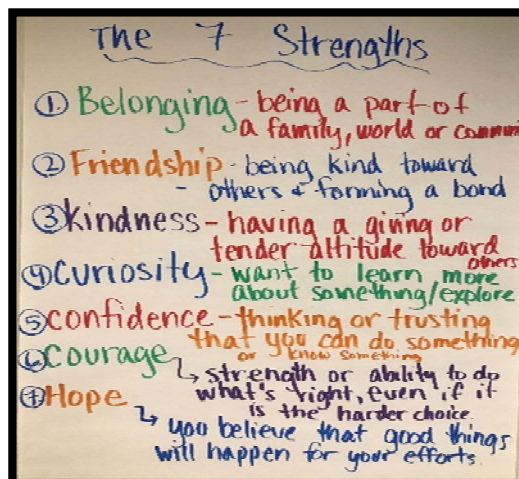
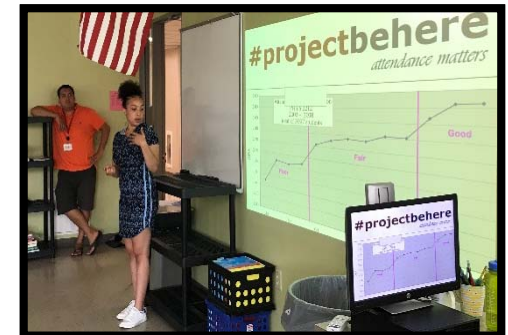


PROGRAM GOALS

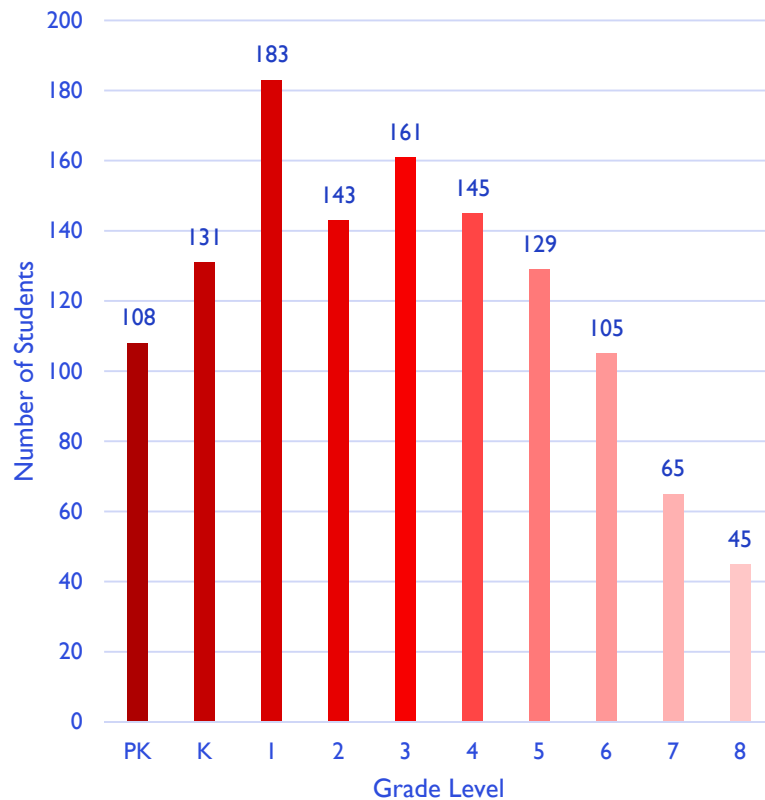

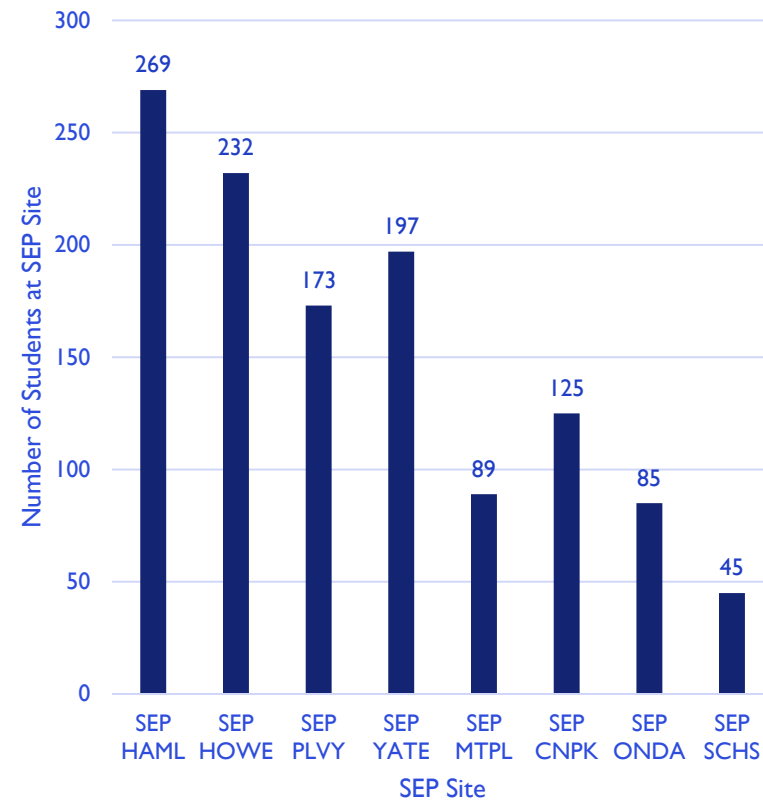

Students by Grade Level



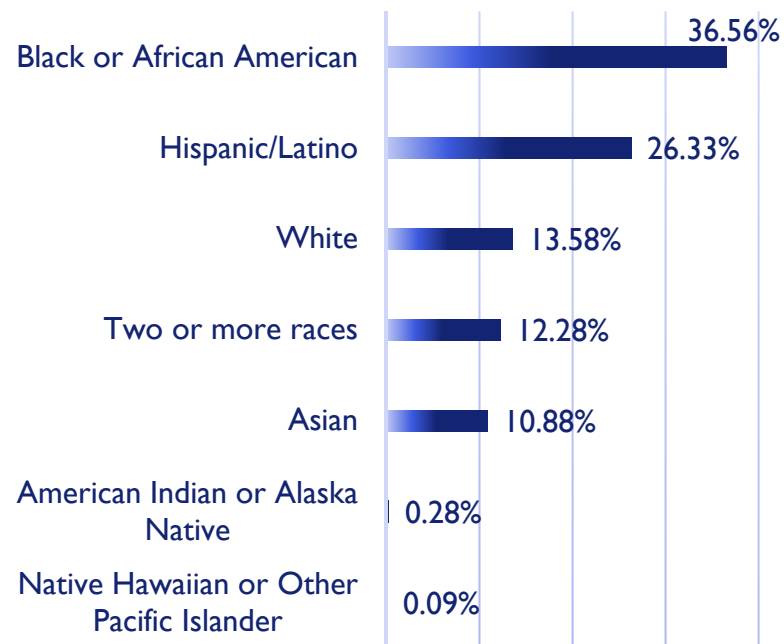

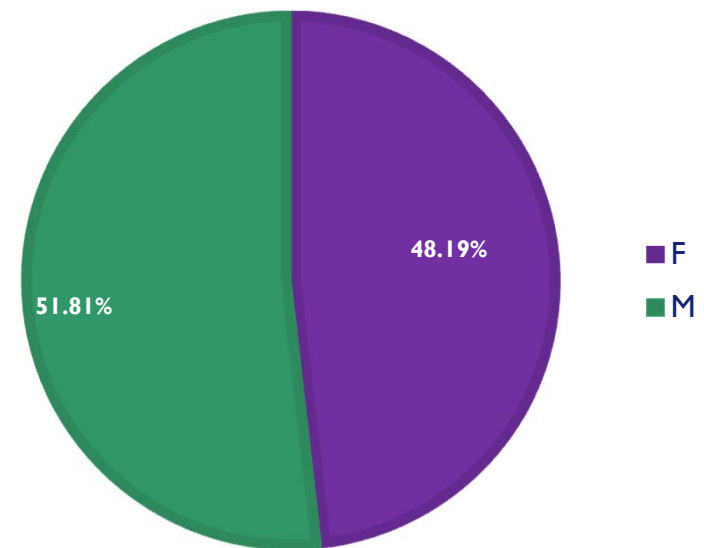

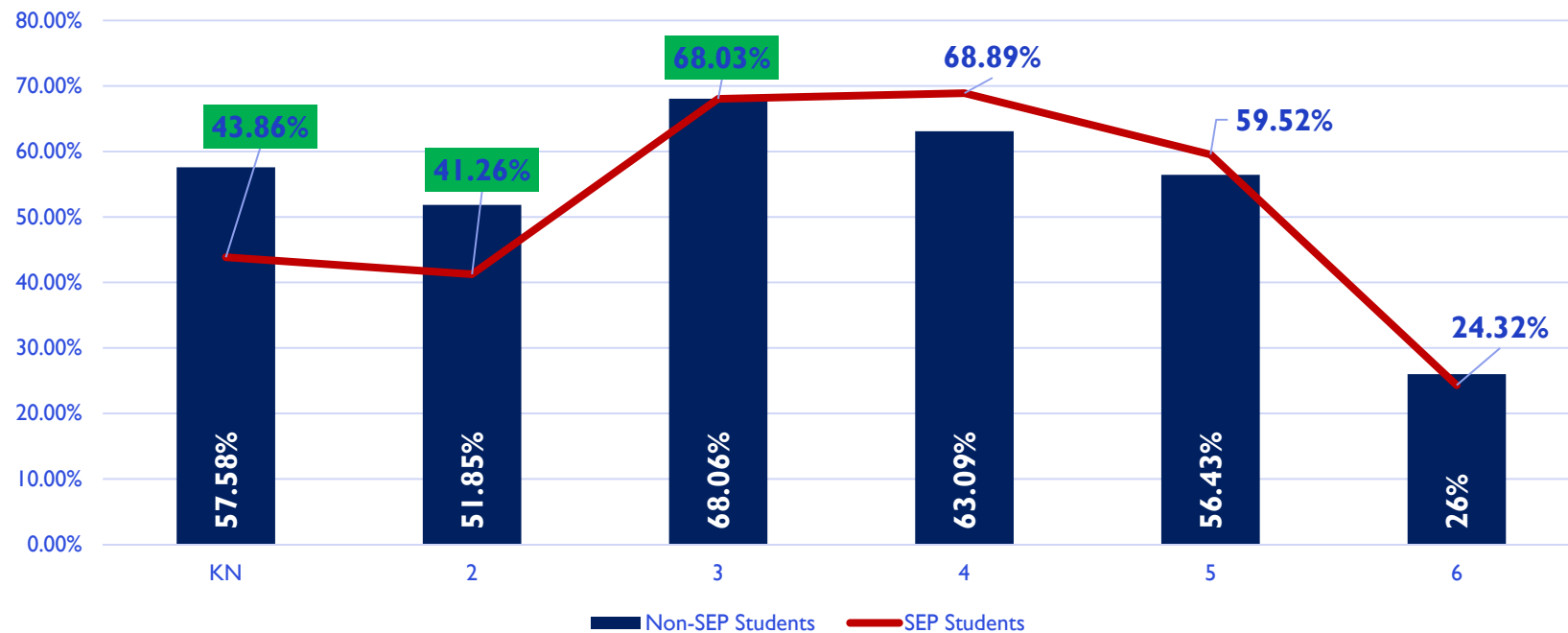

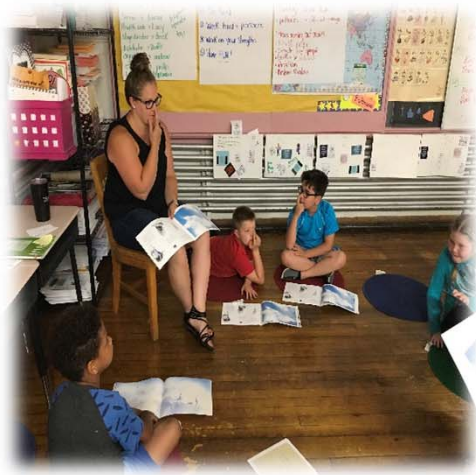
SUMMER ENRICHMENT VS NON SEP STUDENTS

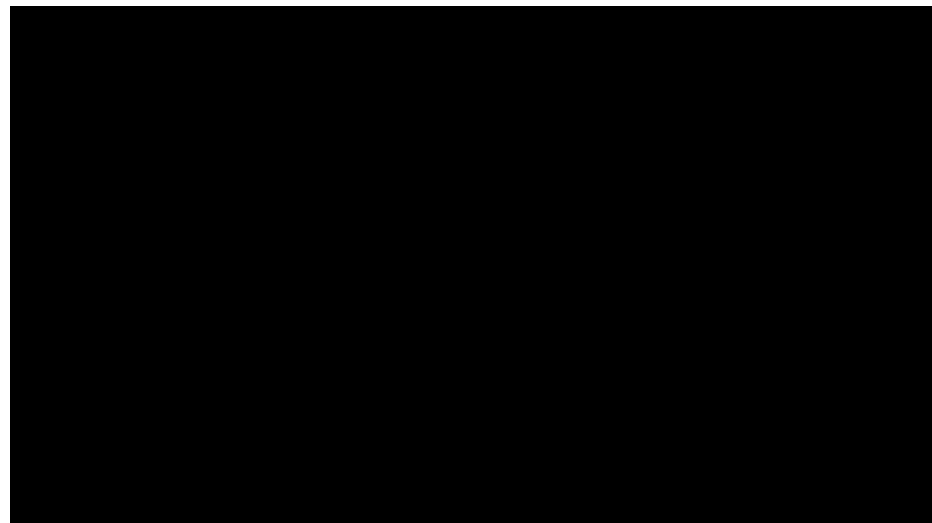

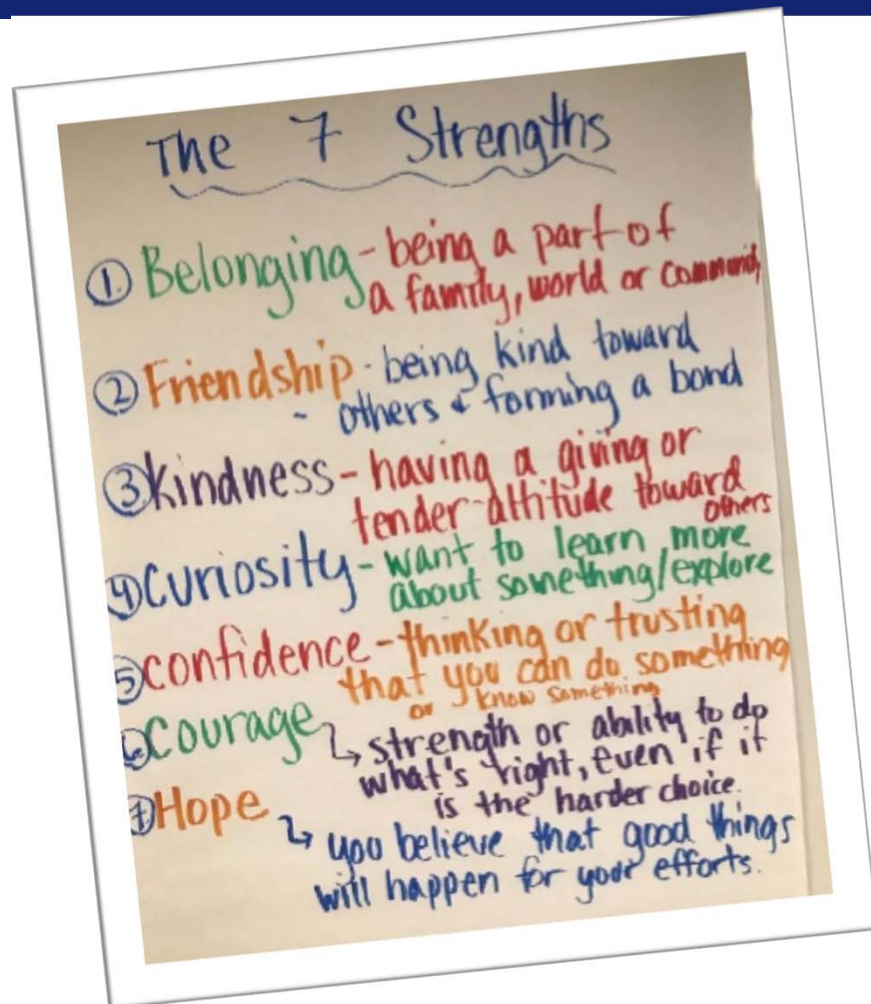
Summer Enrichment Program Vision

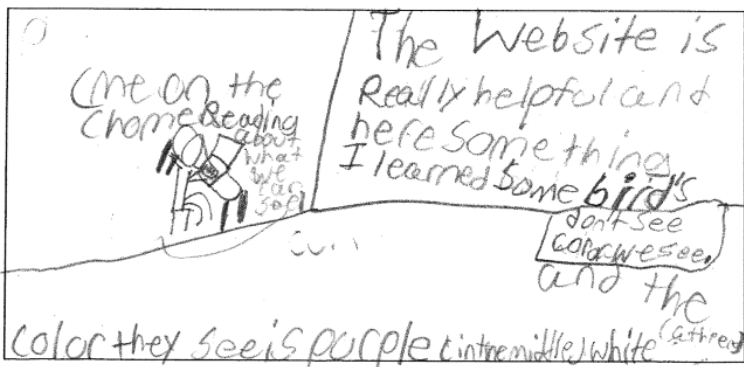

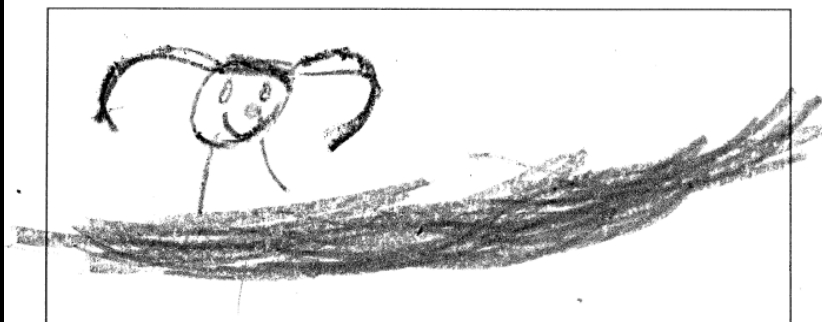

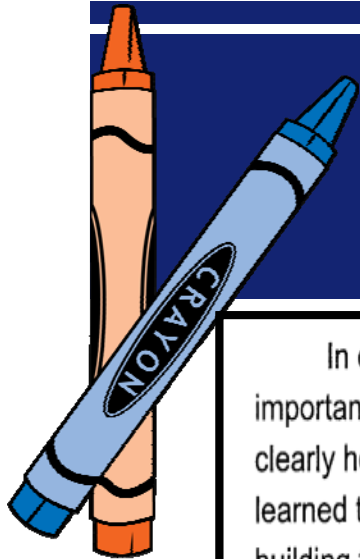

Some things I learned during Summer Enrichment were:

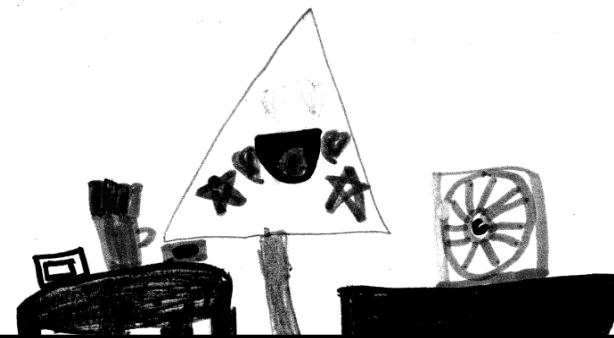
