The 2017 Summer Enrichment Program got underway this week.

Our program was featured in the Daily Gazette and on WNYT recently.

Daily Gazette Story:

Around 650 elementary school students will head back to class Monday for a four-week long summer enrichment program, an initiative district officials hope will go districtwide next year.

The program – hosted at Paige, Pleasant Valley and Martin Luther King elementary schools – will run from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. each weekday through Aug. 4, with lessons and activities blending academics, arts and recreation. Kids will receive transportation and three meals during the program.

At the heart of the summer program are two prime goals: offer parents a place to send their kids over the summer, and work to stanch the "summer slide" that disproportionately sets low-income students back during the summer, as their wealthier peers continue to progress academically.

Working hard this summer to close the opportunity gap

Schenectady teachers and administrators are busy this summer. Not only are administrators, teachers, clinicians and many others serving approximately 650 students 10 hours a day for four weeks at the

summer enrichment program, but, a large group of teachers have also been attending professional development and working all week on developing and writing curriculum.



Next week, a large group of teachers and administrators will be attending a three-day Trauma Sensitive Schools Summer Institute. Developing a trauma-sensitive school is an important initiative of the district. In a trauma-sensitive school, the adults in the school community are prepared to recognize and respond to those who have been impacted by traumatic stress and students are provided with clear expectations and communication strategies to guide them through stressful situations. The goal is to not only provide tools to cope with extreme situations but to create an underlying culture of respect and support. There is an understanding that students must feel safe to learn and teachers have to feel safe to teach. This institute is part of a

plan that includes ongoing professional development and turnkey training.

Coming up in August, elementary teachers will participate in a weeklong Summer Literacy Institute - and - in late August, social studies and other teachers and instructional coaches will participate in a two-day professional development program around historical thinking.
