Parents, Guardians and Caregivers,

It's hard to believe that summer recess is coming to a close and the new school year is just around the corner. We have been working extremely hard across the district during the summer months and are very excited about the work that is underway to close the opportunity gap and help our students succeed. As we prepare to move into the new school year, I am excited to provide you with updates on the important work that we have been doing to ensure that race, economics and disability are never predictors of student achievement in our district.

As many of you know, this summer we piloted a four-week Summer Enrichment Program that served more than 600 students. At first, I'm sure the thought of attending school from 8 a.m. – 6 p.m. each day for four weeks during the summer recess, for many, might not have sounded like a typical – or fun – summer break. But, it was. Students and parents quickly learned that each day of our program was packed with, not only reading and math enrichment, but tons of games, activities, themed projects and opportunities for kids to make new friends from their own and different schools. We received an array of fantastic feedback which will help us as we plan to offer a program that will serve even more students next year.

We have so many dedicated educators who have spent a great deal of their summer recess gaining knowledge, experience, strategizing, designing, practicing and understanding.

In addition to the teachers, administrators, clinicians and other staff who worked with students in the summer program, hundreds of teachers participated in professional development programs and institutes. In July, more than 100 teachers from across the district participated in a three-day Trauma Sensitive Institute, designed to shift thinking and provide educators with tools and strategies to better respond to students in trauma. An important focus within this work is to increase engagement with you, the parent.

About a hundred teachers participated in a curriculum writing program and other teachers, who will serve as coaches this school year, participated in a coach training. This is an intervention and resource model that we are expanding across the district this school year to improve teaching and learning.

Earlier this month, 230 teachers of grades Pre-K through 6 participated in a week-long Literacy Institute to learn about the most effective practices, to test ideas, practice lessons and design learning experiences for students. Teachers learned about their new classroom libraries and how to build a culture of independent reading. I am pleased that the number of participants in the institute doubled from last year.

Capital project work continues to be underway at many of our schools. Construction of the Mont Pleasant bus loop, the Central Park library and the ongoing work at Van Corlaer and Howe has continued throughout the summer. We are excited to be opening the newly expanded Howe Elementary School at its permanent location on Baker Avenue. Phase II planning which includes work at many elementary schools and Schenectady High School is underway.

This school year, we will be implementing a new Visitor Management System, designed to enhance safety and security in all of our schools. The system is linked with the Sex Offender Registry and will maintain an active log of persons known to pose a threat. Anyone other than an enrolled student or active staff member, is required to show identification before entering the school. With the new system, your identification will be scanned and entered into the system. While your identification will not be scanned each time you visit, you will be required to show it. Please be sure to bring identification every time you visit your child's school. This measure is to ensure the safety and security of all of the children in the school. The new system will be piloted at Mont Pleasant Middle School and Schenectady High School on September 6 and then implemented across the district by mid-November. We will follow-up with an updated communication.

This last school year, we launched a new communication tool called "Let's Talk." You can find the tab on the left hand side of the district website or under the Parent dropdown menu. Let's Talk is an engagement platform that is available for you to ask questions and make comments 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There is a team behind each topic on Let's Talk ready to answer your questions and listen to your feedback. Please feel free to share whatever is on your mind. We want you to know that we are listening.

The beginning of the school year offers a fresh start for all students. Please take the opportunity to remind your children of the importance of hard work and starting off on the right foot. Encourage them to attend school every day and to put forth effort so that they will continue to grow and welcome new challenge. Remember, missing just two days of school a month negatively affects a student's academic performance. Attendance also affects graduation and dropout rates. By 6<sup>th</sup> grade, absenteeism is one of the three signs that indicates that a student is likely to drop out of school.


We have enclosed a checklist and attached important information. Don't forget to return enclosed forms and always keep your child's school updated with your contact information.



Please feel free to contact the Transportation Office with any questions or concerns. We are here to help and open from 7:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Emergency calls can be made any time during these hours. Due to call volume, please make routine phone calls between 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m.

## Transportation is provided as follows:

**Policy** 

- Students in grades Pre-K through 5 who attend school more than 1 mile but less than 5.5 miles from their home
- Students in grades 6-12 who attend school more than 1.5 but less than 5.5 miles from their home
- Pre-K students must be four years of age or older before December 1 in order to be eligible for transportation
- Disabled or special needs children in accordance with recommendations of the Committee on Special Education

#### **Measuring Distances**

The district measures the distance between the student's legal residence and the school.

Distances are measured along public thoroughfares used by cars and similar vehicles. The distance measured is between the driveway of the student's legal residence and the main entrance to the school grounds used by the bus.

If you move, please notify your school immediately. Transportation will be set up after your school notifies the Transportation Office.

Each student is assigned to a bus stop in the vicinity of the

student's legal residence. The student will only be transported to and from the bus stop to which the student is assigned. Changes in transportation cannot be communicated by children.

Buses travel main roads. Routes are designed with central pickup points.

You will receive a card from the Transportation Office letting you know where your child's bus stop is and estimated pick-

#### Talking to Children about Rules and Safety

Safety of our children is the most important aspect of what we do, please talk with your child about the rules of riding the bus to ensure their safety and that of the other children (on back side).

Parents must escort Pre-K and kindergarten children to and from the bus stop.

#### Rules

- Go directly to your own bus stop.
- Walk facing traffic and stay on the sidewalk, whenever possible.
- Be on time, we suggest 10 minutes prior to pick up.
- Don't talk or go with strangers.
- Dress for the weather. Wear clothing that is safe, visible and warm.
- Carry your belongings in a book bag or backpack.
- Show care for others' property.
- Do not bring pets to the bus stop.
- Stand on the sidewalk and back from the road at your bus stop. Do not climb snow banks.

#### **Crossing the Road**

- Wait for the bus driver to turn on all exterior signals before crossing and check for traffic.
- Tell your child to make eye contact with the bus driver and walk far enough in front of the bus, so the bus driver can see them.

#### Safe bus behavior

- Do not distract the bus driver
- Remain seated while the bus is moving.
- Elementary students must wear seat belts.
- Eating and smoking are not allowed.
- Keep arms and heads inside windows. Do not throw objects.
- Do not throw objects of any kind

#### **Safety Reminder**

Parents should discuss with their children potential dangers associated with clothing and other items with drawstrings and straps. These items, including backpacks, long scarfs and coats, hanging freely can get caught in the bus door as a student disembarks and cause injury. Please remove all drawstrings from clothing and advise your children to be aware of potential dangers.

#### **Student Behavior**

Students who are disorderly or insubordinate may have bus transportation privileges suspended. In such cases, the parents and/or guardians become responsible for safely getting their child to and from school.

Please talk with your child and reinforce appropriate behavior at the bus stop and while riding the bus to and from school.

### 2017-2018 School Attendance

#### **Student Success Begins with Attendance**

The path to graduation begins with coming to school

The first day of kindergarten is one of the first steps a child takes on the path to graduation. It is a critical time and can set the tone for the educational journey that he or she is beginning. Stressing the importance of being in school and encouraging growth and learning sends the right message to kids. It lets them know that their education is a priority to you and will become a priority to them.

As a parent, you are responsible for making sure your child gets to school each day. While you might think that a few absences here and a few absences there don't add up to much or won't impact learning, they do. Missing 18 days of school, which is ten percent of the time, is considered chronic absenteeism.

Chronic Absence	Missing 18 days in a school year	
Warning – Cause for Concern	Missing 10 – 17 days in a school year	
Good Attendance	Missing 9 days or fewer in a school year	

When children miss one day of school, they miss an entire day of instruction. For every day missed, it takes a child at least two days of school to catch up and they must work twice as hard. They miss opportunities and skill development and have a harder time learning to read. Additionally, a teacher loses class time by having to teach one student something the entire class was taught the day before. An absence impacts the entire class.

#### What attendance tells us:

- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or a facing other serious difficulties.
- By 6<sup>th</sup> grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9<sup>th</sup> grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation than 8<sup>th</sup> grade test scores.

- Missing 10 percent, or 18 days, of the school year can dramatically affect a student's academic success.
- Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.

#### What you can do

- Talk about the importance of going to school every day. Make it an expectation.
- Set a regular bed time and morning routine. Help your child maintain daily routines such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Try not to schedule any appointments, including medical or dental, during the school day.
- Don't schedule family vacations while school is session.
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomachaches may be signs of anxiety.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make him or her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor or other parents.

#### Help your child stay engaged

- Stay on top of academic progress and seek help from teachers if necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school.
- Encourage meaningful afterschool activities including sports and clubs.

Talk to teachers if you notice sudden changes in behavior. Log in to Campus Parent Portal and check your child's attendance frequently.

If you are having trouble getting your child to school, ask for help. Talk to school officials, afterschool programs, other parents or community agencies. We will help you find the resources that you need.

Coming to school every day will give your child the best chance of staying on the path to graduation.
