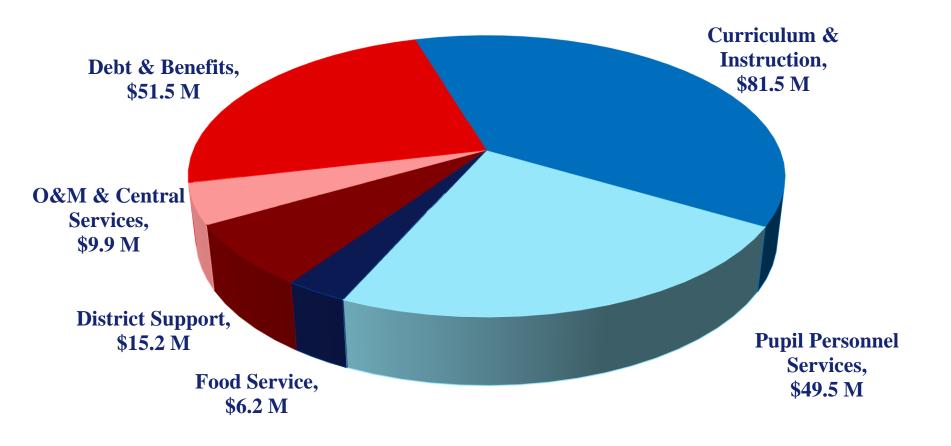

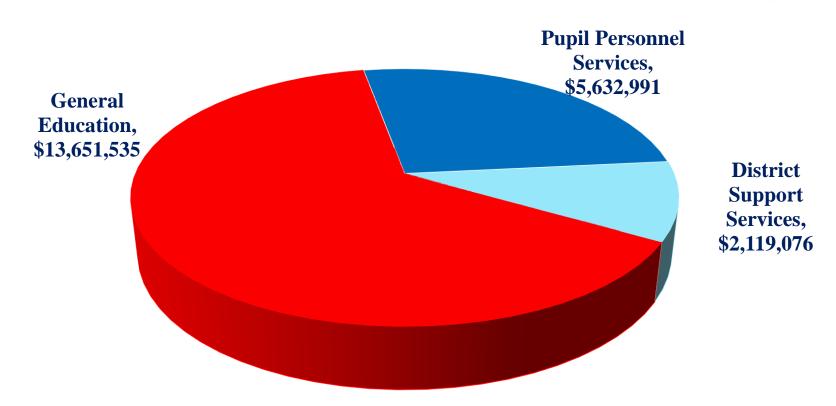
- Expenses: Contractual salary increases, Pension rate changes, projected percentage increases in other areas

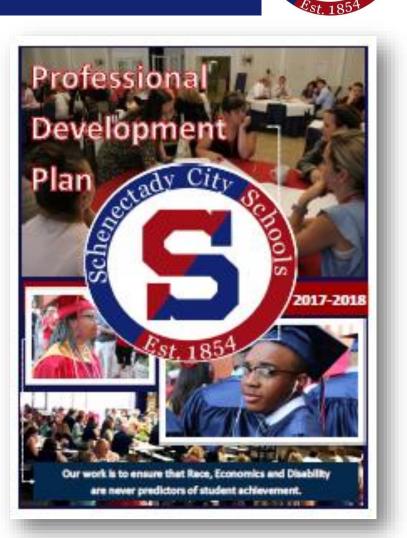

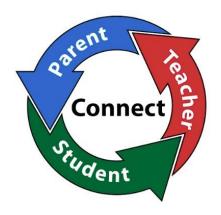




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ESSA: IMPROVING BASIC PROGRAMS (FORMERLY TITLE I)

- Dates: September 1, 2017 to August 31, 2018







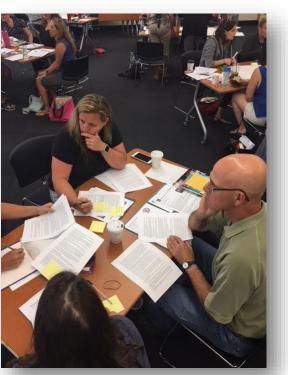


ESSA: SUPPORTING EFFECTIVE INSTRUCTION (FORMERLY TITLE II, PART A)

- Dates: September 1, 2017 to August 31, 2018



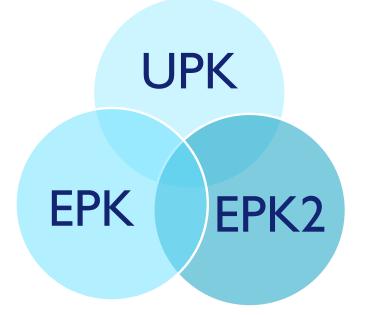

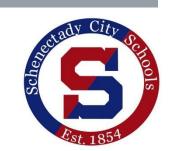

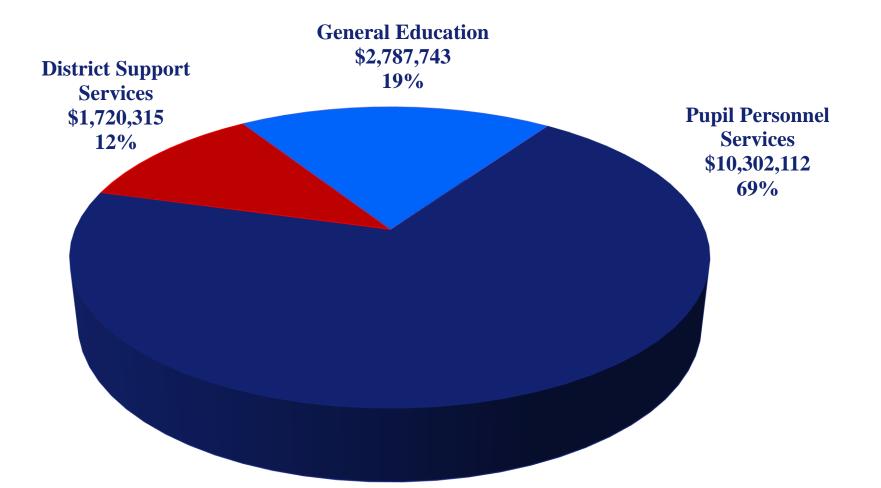
