Over the two days, we discussed process and procedural items but there was also a significant amount of time dedicated to principals working collaboratively and sharing ideas about how to ensure students and staff feel welcome and comfortable and making the opening of school the best it can be.

I understand that some parents are unsettled because you have not yet received student class schedules, supply lists or other details from your school. Please be patient. Your school principal is working tirelessly to prepare for your child's arrival. There are places where we are still working on staff placement and student scheduling. I am excited to share that next week we will be welcoming nearly 100 new educators to our district. Our induction will kick-off Monday morning with an orientation followed by three full days of learning and opportunity for our new educators to acclimate to the district, their new schools, and our community. WILL YOUR CHILD USE DISTRICT TRANSPORTATION? TRANSPORTATION CONFIRMATION

We are asking parents, guardians and caregivers of students whose children are eligible for district transportation to confirm that your child will utilize transportation service to and from school and will wear a mask. Please complete it now by clicking here.

Transportation Eligibility

- Elementary students who live a minimum of one mile from school
- Middle and High School students who live a minimum of 1.5 miles from school

If your child does not meet the transportation eligibility requirements, you do not need to complete the form.


