



#### STAFF TRAINING OPPORTUNITY

Schenectady City School District has teamed with Cornell University to bring Therapeutic Crisis Intervention in School (TCIS) to our classrooms. TCIS is a proven series of strategies to improve student learning through environmental shifts, teacher self-awareness, and coping skill development. It is traumainformed care at the best level.

The TCIS Training Team offers trainings leading to certification in full TCIS as well as updates for those who were certified in the last 12 to 18 months. TCIS may be required for some of our special education programs too.

The initial training is a five-day, evening training. We have an upcoming training from **September 20 – 24** from 4-8 p.m. It is a paid training.

To sign up, please <u>complete the form</u> and speak with your principal or supervisor about your interest.

**Interested in a refresher?** If you were certified or updated in the last 12-18 months, we can offer you a refresher. COVID-19 has allowed us some additional time beyond the traditional 6 months. <u>Sign up here</u>.
