Good afternoon,

As we finish our second full week of school, I have a few things that I want to share and provide follow-up on. At Wednesday evening's board of education meeting, I shared our district's plan for spending the American Rescue Plan (ARP) funding. This is funding being provided to schools by the federal government to help with mitigation strategies so that students can stay in school and to address the impact that the pandemic has had on students and learning. Our district is poised to receive approximately \$41.3 million to use over the next four years. We will have the opportunity to provide tutoring and enrichment, boost curriculum, services and supports, make upgrades and more. Our plan was shaped by feedback collected from stakeholders over a period of several months, including a survey that you were asked to complete in the spring. The plan must be submitted to the government by the end of the month and considered for approval. We are preparing to submit our plan and will continue to keep you updated. The board of education also had a lengthy discussion about vaccinations for athletes. This comes on the heels of a single COVID positive case on our football team that resulted in the team having to forfeit their first game of the season due to quarantine requirements because most of the team was not vaccinated. In addition to missing the first game, all the players required to quarantine, also had to stay home from school. Vaccination of athletes is not mandatory according to Section 2 (our sports league), but districts can decide to mandate it and some in our area have.

What's notable is that, not only does the vaccination protect against COVID, but any vaccinated athlete who is exposed to COVID would not be required to guarantine unless they have symptoms. So, in the case of the football team, if all members had been vaccinated, the only player sitting out of the game and the classroom would have been the one who tested positive.

The board did not make a decision about it. They had a great discussion and shared a variety of perspectives. Over the next two weeks, we plan to engage with studentathletes and parents and will develop a proposal to present to the board at the October 6 board of education meeting.

Finally, please join me in congratulating Michaela McBride Miranda, who was named Director of Athletics this week. Some of you know Ms. Miranda as a teacher from King, others as an administrator from the high school, and most recently as the principal of Van Corlaer. She brings to her new role an array of leadership skills as well as the experience of being an athlete and coach. Ms. Miranda is committed to expanding athletic opportunities for our students and making our sports program the best that it can be. Most importantly, she has a passion for Schenectady and our students. She will be an advocate for your child and all our student-athletes.

Ms. Miranda is only the second female athletic director in Schenectady's history and is one of only two currently in Section 2. We should be very proud. #SchenectadyRising




