

October is National Farm to School Month! Our district is a recipient of a USDA Farm to School planning grant. The Farm to School initiative brings healthy, local, and fresh food to schools in Schenectady, while providing students with hands-on learning opportunities through agriculture education and growing activities.

The initiative connects schools, farms, and community partners to improve student nutrition and learning through agriculture, health, and nutrition education; and strengthens our economy by supporting local farmers and food producers. The curriculum was piloted this summer with second graders in our Summer Enrichment Program, and we are now working to implement academic year activities at those sites while expanding to other schools in our district.
