COVID-19 VACCINATIONS

Schenectady County continues to offer free COVID-19 vaccinations at a variety of locations throughout the month. All PODS are open to walk-ins. **The December schedule is available <u>here.</u>**

WHEN YOU HAVE SYMPTOMS

If You Are Vaccinated

Fully vaccinated staff members and students and those recently recovering from COVID-19 **who have symptoms**, can provide a negative test result to stay in school (antigen or PCR). If a negative test result is provided, exclusion is not required.

If You Are Unvaccinated

Unvaccinated staff members and students **who have symptoms** are still required to take a PCR test or be out for 10 days.

What is the difference between a PCR and antigen COVID-19 test?

Each of these tests detects a different part of the virus and how it works influences the test's speed and accuracy.

PCR (Polymerase chain reaction) tests are sensitive and accurate. They require a skilled lab process that can take longer to produce results.

Antigen tests are easy to use, require no special training and can be taken at home. They produce results quickly and are inexpensive. However, they can be less accurate than PCR tests.





ABOUT P-EBT BENEFITS

If you have reached out to the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) with issues only to be referred to the district, please be aware that the deadline to resolve issues has expired.

If your child's benefits were reported incorrectly or are don't exist, please submit an appeal immediately.

Resolution may take some time.

Things you can do:

Lookup the payment status for your child's school by clicking on the NYS School List. This will let you know whether payments are in review, issuing or pending. It can take a few weeks in "issuing."

The <u>FAQ</u> may provide answers to some of your questions.


If you believe the determination is incorrect, you should submit and appeal using the P-EBT Information Form Once you complete the first page, additional questions will appear. Question 14 asks that you select your issue. Once an issue is selected, an answer will be provided. If it does not answer your question, select "no" and you will be given the opportunity to provide additional information about your claim or concern. Be sure to hit "submit."
