Happy New Year! I hope that you had a wonderful recess and holiday season. While we all needed a little break and time with family, we did miss you and are glad to see you back.

As everyone is aware and as expected, COVID-19 infection rates are spiking across the country following the holiday season. It's no different in our area and our district. The rates are higher this week than they have been. Health and safety in our schools continue to be a priority along with our goal to keep school open for in-person instruction. We are implementing all our safety and mitigation tools and resources and continue to do all we can to keep our schools safe and open to our students, however with growing positive cases, we must be prepared to pivot to remote instruction if absolutely necessary. This is a challenging time for parents, students, and staff. I appreciate the hard work and commitment of everyone in our school community. Despite the many challenges, you have been amazing. Thank you.

Yesterday we sent out updated protocols regarding isolation and quarantine requirements for staff and students who test positive for COVID and for those who are exposed to someone who tested positive. We also shared the testing protocol for returning to school when you have symptoms. The changes to these protocols ensure that students and staff can return as quickly as possible. It's also great news that we are now allowed to accept over the counter rapid home tests (two tests are required along with attestation of results). Please read the updated document carefully. We work closely and communicate daily with Schenectady County Public Health (SCPH). Any updates to our protocols reflect guidance provided SCPH. This information changes often and quickly. We will always keep you updated. Other COVID data and information as well as testing and vaccination information is included on page three.

Before we went into the holiday break, our district's annual spelling bee was held at Mont Pleasant. I want to extend a huge congratulations to our top seven spellers who are advancing to the regional spelling bee in February at Proctors. Congratulations to Pratiksha "Sami" Gangadin, an 8th grader at Central Park, who came in first place. Joel Sandia, a 5th grader at Zoller, placed second. Evangeline Cruceta, a 4th grader at Van Corlaer, earned the third spot. We wish them much luck in the regional bee and will be cheering them on.
