Happy Friday! I hope that you are doing well and that you and your family are staying healthy. I want to start my brief this week by again saying thank you to everyone for your continued patience and understanding. As you are aware, the guidance and information that we receive regarding COVID protocols continues to evolve and comes to us daily. It seems we put something out to you and then a day or two later it, or something else, changes again. We know it can sometimes be confusing and difficult to follow.

This week, we were informed that the local department of health will no longer be conducting contact tracing when there is a positive case or exposure. What does that mean? When there is a positive case, the department of health will not be notifying those who were exposed to someone who tested positive and the next steps. That means it is important for everyone in our school community to self-manage by knowing what steps to take when you are positive, have symptoms, or find out you were exposed to someone.

We will continue to work closely with Schenectady Public Health to make sure that we continue to have updated information and resources to share with you so that you continue to be informed and can protect yourself. These resources are the guidelines and protocols that we update and share with you regularly with steps you should take given certain situations. You can also find them on page three and on the front page of our website.

While the health department will no longer be doing contact tracing, we will continue to our best to manage and notify staff and families of close contact exposures in school along with the appropriate action to follow.

Always monitor yourself and your child for symptoms and always follow the guidelines and protocols. It is important for anyone who experiences symptoms to test for COVID. We have test kits available for staff and students. If you need one, please contact your school nurse. Keep in mind, you can <u>make an appointment</u> at the new testing site for staff and families at the Ellis McClellan Campus.

I am very proud that we continue to provide in-person learning despite having a dramatic increase in the number of COVID positive cases. I'm grateful to everyone who is going above and beyond. We have an amazing team across our district, and everyone is doing their part to help and support one another in school. It takes all of us to do this. Thank you. We will continue to do the best we can but, as I mentioned last week, we must remain prepared to transition to remote teaching and learning if necessary. Please continue to watch for updates because, as you know, things can change quickly. We do hope that in the coming weeks, as we move further from the holiday surge, the number of cases will begin to decrease.

As I'm sure you do, we are always paying attention to the forecast and watching for what might come our way in terms of winter weather. Looking ahead, we want you to know that we follow a process and have criteria to determine if we need to close or delay school due to poor conditions. We gather information early in the morning from several sources and take a number of factors into consideration. These include the weather at the time, the forecast for later in the day, driving conditions, walking conditions and more. We work hard to make any decision about school early so that we can communicate it by 6 a.m. when possible. I know that we are hearing reports there is snow in the forecast for this weekend into Monday. We will keep a close watch and will be up early Tuesday morning to monitor and see how things are. If it impacts school, we will announce and let you know bright and early.

I wish you a fantastic weekend and holiday on Monday in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The holiday honors the legacy of <u>Dr. King</u>, and focuses on civil rights, highlights the use of nonviolence to promote change and the call to public service. It's important to celebrate Dr. King and find ways to apply what we learned from him to our everyday lives and the lives of our children.

## **Grades K-5 Literacy Steering Committee Update**

The SCSD Literacy Steering Committee has been meeting over the last year to identify needs in the K-5 Comprehensive Literacy Curriculum. The committee, including members from each of the elementary schools, conducted an audit of the district's current curriculum and reviewed research around effective literacy practices and the science of reading. The committee agreed that a comprehensive literacy program from grades K-5 was needed to ensure that all students across all settings receive evidence based, high-level, rigorous Tier 1 instruction in reading and writing. The intention of the committee is to have a new K-5 Comprehensive Literacy Curriculum identified and purchased by the end of this school year with the goal of implementation for next school year. Through research and careful selection, the curriculum programs were narrowed down to three: Bookworms (Open Up Resources), EL Education (Open Up Resources, and Wit & Wisdom (Great Minds). During the month of January, each school will identify a selection team made up of administrators and teachers who will review each of these programs using an evaluation rubric.
