Dear Schenectady Community, TGIF!

I know it was a bit confusing early in the week following the Nassau County Supreme Court ruling regarding the mask mandate and then the "stay" that was granted until the appeal is heard, and as court proceedings continue. We hear both sides of the mask argument from our school community, and understand both sides, but the decision regarding masks does not rest with the school district. Action that we take is guided by directives from the New York State Education Department, New York State, and the Department of Health. As such, the mask mandate continues to be in effect while court proceedings continue. When there is any change, we will post it publicly on our website, social media platforms, in my weekly brief, and communicate it directly to parents and staff. With all the confusion and information circulating this week, I applaud our staff, students and their families for your patience and cooperation.

As you will see on our COVID update and resource page, our COVID numbers continue to decrease following the holiday surge. I do want to take the opportunity to thank everyone, particularly our school faculty and staff, for doing everything possible to help, support and cover classes for one another when necessary. This was the reason why we were able to keep our doors open to our students so far. This is important to me and it's clear that it is just as important to you. It wasn't easy this last month, but we did it together. Thank you. #schenectadyrising

I have one more COVID-related update. We emailed a letter to all families last night letting you know that we received another supply of COVID-19 rapid test kits. We will be providing these to every student on Monday so that you have them accessible when needed. If you do not wish to receive a test kit, please let us know. The letter and plan for distribution is posted here.

Last week I mentioned that a redesign of our secondary programming will be underway. In addition to the focus group and listening sessions that are coming up, we will be launching an online survey for school community participation. Please watch for it next week. Once it is launched, we will share it out through all our communication channels. I will also include in my brief. Please participate. We want to know what is important to you as we work to create more opportunities and make our schools the best that they can be.

Soon, we will also be launching a 2022-2023 Budget Development Survey to collect input on what should be prioritized as we build the budget and to collect any suggestions you have for the new school year. We will keep you updated through the budget process. Mr. Gillooley, our district's chief financial officer, will share information regarding the budget process and present an overview of the district reserves and fund balance at the February 2 board of education meeting. Presentations and updates will be posted following each meeting on the 2022-2023 Budget section of our website.

We have many positions across the district that we are seeking to fill as soon as possible. Please help spread the word about our first SCSD Virtual Career Expo on February 17 from 4-8 p.m. Representatives from all areas of our district will be on-hand to talk in real-time with candidates and schedule interviews. We hope those of you in the Schenectady community who are interested in learning about employment opportunities in our district, will stop in for this event. We would love to meet you and share information about working in Schenectady. You might be a good fit.

It's hard to believe that the month of February begins next week. As we move along, we continue our work to improve and be the best that we can be. I am grateful for your partnership and collaboration and to be doing this work with you. We are #schenectadyrising.

SUNY Schenectady Earns \$2 Million Grant Renewal for Schenectady
Smart Transfer Early College High School Program

SUNY Schenectady announced that the college will continue to make it possible for Schenectady High School students to earn their associate degrees while still in high school through the renewal of a grant totaling \$2 million from the New York State Department of Education.

The college first introduced the Schenectady Smart Transfer Early College High School Program in 2017. With renewal of the grant through 2026, the college will continue to welcome Smart Transfer students into SUNY Schenectady academic programs as they earn their high school diplomas and college degrees at the same time.

"I am extremely grateful for this partnership and program which presents an incredible opportunity and pathway for our students to continue their educational journey, earn college credits while in high school, and ultimately achieve their educational goals," said Superintendent Soler. "The program truly makes a difference, especially in the lives of those students who earn a college degree while still in high school. This is the strength of partnership and community. We are thrilled that the funding is renewed, and the opportunity will continue."





NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH






Mentoring is a great way to develop leadership skills, build resume experience, and have a positive impact in the local community
