



Problem Statement





Problem Statement: The current SCSD K-5 Literacy *Program of Study* has not sufficiently prepared students toward reading proficiency by Grade 3

Additional issues to address:

- Our SCSD students came back to school in September 2021 from a full year of virtual schooling; all of us are surviving a pandemic
- Our SCSD teachers did the best that they could, but teaching students to read virtually was a struggle
- SCSD teachers used a vast array of tools available to them, but there was little to no consistency in approach between teachers from classroom to classroom and school to school
