Good afternoon and happy Friday,

I will start by saying thank you Deputy Superintendent Rutnik and the Secondary Redesign Team for all that work that you have been doing to collect input, data, and information and for continuing to explore options, opportunities and many pathways that can open doors, empower, and support our students on their path to graduation and beyond.

Members of the team including students and a parent, presented an update to the board of education Wednesday evening. They outlined why this work is important and the vision, which ultimately is to make sure every student graduates from Schenectady High School ready for college, career, family, or military.

Over the last few months, the team has been collecting feedback and studying data. Group presentations have been held for the school and community, and a survey conducted. More than 1000 members of our school community participated in the survey. A summary of the results were shared including areas that were identified as strengths and for improvement. Most participants agreed that a program designed specifically for incoming freshmen would be beneficial.



UPDATE ON THE SECONDARY REDESIGN

During the March 16 Board of Education Meeting, the district's Secondary School Redesign Committee presented an update on the process and outlined next steps. Watch the 30-minutes presentation complete with slide presentation here.

The presentation highlighted some of the community sites that the team visited for possible collaboration, the work of other pathway and project-based schools, and some of the thoughts and ideas from students, parents, and faculty. The steering committee recommended a timeline and process which includes three phases with a plan for phase one to be announced in April with an eye on implementation for the fall. I look forward to keeping you updated. This is exciting work that has the potential to change the high school experience by providing students pathways, experiences, and supports that keep them engaged and on the path toward reaching their high school and post-high school goals.
